How to view the videos.

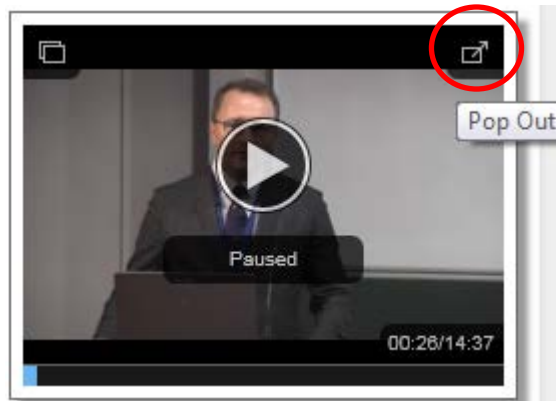
Please follow either of the two alternative below.

Alternative 1
